



### Background

- ☐ This project is based on envisaged partnership approach in 2017,to overcome challenges faced by the NWU and surrounding NWU campuses.
- □ Proposal was compiled; approved by LIS management, internal and external stakeholders.
- ☐ Partnership was established in 2018 through SASOL community trust sponsorship.
- ☐ The tripartite MOU was signed in October 2018.
- ☐ Stakeholders engagement materialised in November 2018 for planning.
- ☐ With the aim of addressing the needs of the visually impaired.

### Project Objectives.

- ☐ Contribute to new knowledge generation and capacity building enablement over time.
- ☐ Maximise efficient use of existing infrastructure.
- ☐ Share resources and expertise that would result in fully independent persons.
- □ Contribute to skills development to effect professional growth and personal development.
- ☐ Support and enhance existing provincial information literacy.

### Problem Statement.

- □Identify and address barriers and challenges for VI society.
- □ Establishment of libraries for the VI society.
- □Identify basic information literacy needs for VI.
- □ Lack of training establishments facilities.
- □ Lack of VI awareness support.



### Methodology

- ■24 community libraries were sampled for piloting.
- ☐ Feasibility study conducted using the following sources:

  - ✓ IFLA checklist.
- ☐ An observation checklist revealed a need of an intervention in service provision.
- □ Compliance with legislative guides regarding IL.
  - ✓ Constitution
  - ✓ Bill of rights.
  - ✓ White paper 2006,2010.
  - ✓ SALB Act.
  - ✓ Promotion of access to information act.

### Purpose of VI mini library.

- To make community libraries in the North West Province accessible to VI's.
- To train identified community library officials on VI services.
- Mobilising and enrolment of VI patrons.



# Findings.

- □Limited services for Patrons.
- □ Affordability of assistive devices.
- □Compromised level of literacy.
- □Outdated assistive devices and curriculum in special schools.
- □Ignorance of services available and support for VI.
- ■Social factor (Behaviour, living conditions, communication).
- □ Psychological factors (attitude).

### Implications.

- ■Promotion of service and available support.
- ■Sensitization of the society on how to interact with the VI's.
- ■Need for training of staff in various types of libraries.
- □Integration of library functions to cater for all societal groups.
- □ Promotion of social cohesion through inclusive reading (NDP).
- □ Exposure of visually impaired society to latest ICT resources.

### Usefulness of the project.

- □Involved and informed society.
- ☐ Improved levels of literacy.
- ☐ Enhanced VI service points.
- □ Retrain users and staff on ICT and IL developments.
- ☐ Sustainability-
