RESEARCH DATA MANAGEMENT (RDM)

 Research Data Management is the process of controlling the information generated during a research project. Any research will require some level of <u>data management</u>. <u>Research</u> <u>funders</u> are increasingly requiring proof of sound data management practices. Managing data ia an integral part of the research process.

RESEARCH COMMONS

The <u>dedicated Research areas</u> in all three libraries give exclusive access to postgraduate students and researchers.

These areas provide the opportunity to work in a secluded space conducive to research and offer the following:

- spacious computer work stations
- seminar rooms which can be booked via the library web page
- individual study cubicles
- · ample power plugs for laptops and tables
- printing and scanning facilities
- computers equipped with research software programmes
- research support.

1.PREPARE

Decide on a research topic, formulate your research question and plan the project. **Our Research Colorations** are here to assist you with your research.



2. GATHER

enable you to find literature sources and develop your research skills.

3. CREATE

Use these to analyse your data, create and manage your research.

Referencing

- Writefull Cite (Ask your librarian for assistance)
- EndNote (Training sessions are provided)
- NWU Referencing Guide Data Analysis Tools
- Research tools like Atlas.ti, SPSS and STATISTA are installed on computers in the libraries' dedicated research areas. Writing and proofreading
- Consult Postgradute MS Word Template
- Contact NWU writing centres and language editors
- Writefull Revise (Ask your librarian for assistance)



4. PRESERVE

Manage and preserve research output (theses/dissertations, articles etc) in the Institutional Repository (Boloka) and

in the Institutional Research Data Repository (Figshare). Institutional Repositories preserve and indexes NWU research output and research data, resulting into increased visibility and impact of NWU research.



5. PUBLISH / SHARE

Publish and share in the print and digital forms. Select take into account Journal Impact Factors and Guidelines for Authors on Open Access - The NWU Libraries are committed to Open Access. The New Journal open access at no cost to you from journals negotiated by Binding of research the library assists with the binding of theses and dissertations.



6. MEASURE / IMPACT

Researchers are increasingly required to report the impact of their research, and there are several souls available for extracting relevant information for:

- Faculty Impact Factors (JCR)
- Research(er) profiles (register for an ORCID ID)
- Grant application
